From Educators, With Love

We called for submissions for a series titled *From Educators*, *With Love*. The series asked educators to write - in the form of letters to colleagues, students, family members, and policy makers - about their views on educational spaces and their ideas to increase inclusivity in educational spaces. We received several letters, of which 10 were shortlisted. This series of letters posted on the portal generated nearly 300 comments, inviting educators from various schools to discuss their ideas on equity and sensitivity in educational spaces.

Using the letter format - more personal than the traditional essay - meant that the participants were able to draw on and narrativise their personal experiences as educators. This allowed them to share insightful learnings with the reader.

Several participants indicated that the education system would benefit from sensitivity to students' varied needs and from the acknowledgement that education should be tailored to the context in which it is imparted. The discussion on the portal highlighted the need to reflect upon the existing practices and possible ways to bring about change. Click here to read the letters!


